Your job as a moderator

If you are moderating a Session:

- Keep the event moving by keeping track of the time. If needed, inform speakers when they are approaching the end of their time.
- During Q&A, select questions and read them to the speakers and audience for the speakers to respond to as a panel.

If you are moderating a **Breakout Discussion**:

- Start the call from your computer using the login/pass we have provided you.
- Curate a healthy online atmosphere.



How do I curate a healthy atmosphere?

Each situation will be unique, but we've selected you as a moderator because we trust your judgement to uphold a happy, healthy atmosphere for discussion. Ideally, you shouldn't have to do much at all, but watch attendees chatter excitedly about the things they love — but we want you there, just in case.

What we expect from attendees

We have two simple rules for attendees, including our moderators:



Be respectful. Don't use obscene, lewd, or excessively violent language.



Be kind. Do not insult, harass, or demean others.

What to do when someone is misbehaving

If an attendee is being either disrespectful or unkind, we ask that you do the following:

First Offense: Give that person a warning.

Second Offense: Remove that person from the call.
